



The Paschal (Easter) Candle

CCSY Associate Priest and *ArtSearch* founder Mother Jenny Nelson has again – as she does faithfully and prayerfully each year – embellished our Paschal Candle with rich symbols and text. This year's artwork features themes from John's gospel, most strikingly the golden eagle (the symbol of the fourth evangelist which can be seen in the rose window high up on the west wall). At the start of his majestic prologue, John echoes in Greek (transliterated *en arche*) the opening word of the Hebrew Bible (transliterated *b'reshith*) 'In the beginning...' By this clear literary allusion, John is claiming that in the Word made flesh we have an act of creation which is of a piece with God's first calling of light out of darkness in Genesis. The Greek and Hebrew letters on the candle highlight this theological resonance. Thank-you Mother Jenny!
